### FROM THE VEEP

#### Winter RC Flying: Embracing the Chill, or Chili, Whatever Works

When winter arrives, many RC flying enthusiasts pack away their models until spring. Including myself. But for those willing to brave the cold, winter offers a unique and rewarding experience. Crisp air, stunning snowy landscapes, and quieter flying fields can make for truly memorable flights.

Before heading out, make sure your batteries are fully charged and keep them warm until you're ready to fly, as cold temperatures can reduce their performance.

Dress in layers to stay comfortable and consider using gloves designed for dexterity and warmth. I find that I cannot fly with gloves on, so making sure my hands are warm prior to a flight is essential. Pre-flight checks are extra important—cold can make plastic brittle, so inspect your gear thoroughly. Also, the silicone lubricant in servos will thicken when exposed to cold.

Flying in winter also means navigating different challenges, installing floats on an aircraft works just as well as skis, in my opinion. Just protect those foam floats with a piece of packing tape and you're good to go.

I will be the first to admit, I usually hang up the transmitter in the winter. But with a properly prepared airplane and a pocket full of batteries, it can be a pretty good time.

Also remember, we have more dates coming up for indoor flying. Again, I didn't know if I'd like it. I built a Synergy from Twisted Hobbies and really enjoy the challenge. It also makes you fly with your left thumb more than most of us are accustomed to. Never a bad thing.

Ultimately, winter RC flying is about adapting and enjoying the season. With the right preparation and a spirit of adventure, you'll discover a whole new side to your favorite hobby. So, bundle up, grab your transmitter, and take to the skies this winter!

Anthony (Tony) Forchas and Ted Sander have always backed me up when I wasn't available since I presented this to the SPMRC club and I truly appreciate all of the assistance and comradery they have provided.

I have been asked to present a combat build session for ACRC members that might be interested in building combat planes. The sessions will be tentatively planned to occur before the February and March meetings. This time would be dedicated for members interested in building combat planes for the 2026 flying season. If we have four or more members interested the two sessions will be part of the monthly meetings for these two months. The combat build sessions will be from 5:00 till 7:00 before the monthly membership meetings occurring from 7:00 thru 9:00.
